CCS NIAM Agri-Business Incubator (NABI) has achieved various milestones in its journey of two years of continuous efforts and development. By providing successful incubation support to 59 Startups and a funding support to 39 Startup amounting to Rs. 4.58 Crs from the MoA&FW, NABI has earned its recognition in the Agri-ecosystem. NABI supported startups are operating in various fields including Agri-Supply Chain, Post-Harvest Management, Agri-Logistics, Agri-Infrastructure, Natural Resource Management, Agri-Mechanization etc.

NIAM Agri-Business Incubator (NABI) has selected Agripreneurs and Startups from various part of the country and amalgamated these scalable ideas from more than 14 states including Himachal Pradesh, Assam, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh and the list goes on. Out of 59 participants trained by NABI, 9 were female and 50 were male. 






KISAN MITR WEBINAR SERIES



GRANT RECEIVED FOR SECOND COHORT OF AGRI START UPS

14 Startups - 1.50 Crore Grant-in-Aid (including AOP (IDEA STAGE) + SABIP (SEED STAGE)

Out of the 23 Startups were incubated at CCS NIAM Agri-Business Incubator (NABI) under Pre-seed stage and Seed Stage, 14 Startups (6 SABIP & 8 AOP) were recommended in the RC Meeting with a funding of Rs. 1.50 Crores in cumulative. You might have read stories of successful founders from 20s decade that how much backlash they faced from family and society when they decided to startup. But no longeris starting-up a taboo in the society and in-fact it has reached to a level where it is considered quite fancy to start-up even without a concrete roadmap and vision. The later category is generally called as 'Wannapreneurs'. While 'Wannapreneurs' are a very important part of the ecosystem but it is important to understand the journey of becoming entrepreneur from 'Wannapreneurs.' Following are the steps to follow and to give-up the tag of a 'Wannapreneurs' and becoming an entrepreneur:

JOURNEY FROM WANNAPRENEURS TO ENTREPRENEURS

- Intent of Starting-up: Most of the 'Wannapreneurs' I have met, wanted to startup as it would make them famous. After reading stories of a few successful start-ups they get inspired and choose to travel on the road less travelled.
- While it is good to get motivation but the objective of starting-up should be crystal clear to founder. A start-up starts with identifying a problem around which a solution and later a business model is developed.
- Website and App Development: Another set of 'Wannapreneurs' develops a website along with a mobile app as the first step to start-up and start calling themselves a start-up. Generally, these set of 'Wannapreneurs' are also not clear in their objective of starting-up and lacks the vision.
- Funding: Most of the 'Wannapreneurs' falls under this category where the whole and sole objective of starting-up is to raise big rounds of funding from investors. These wannapreneurs wants to become millionaires instantly and consider external investment a shortcut to this.
- External investment in a startup generally happens once it has a proven product-market fit. Raising external investment is not easy and takes a dedicated team with a vision.
- Copycat: Remember the number of hyper-local start-ups which were there a few years back. Most of these start-ups were just a copy of each others' product/services. While these start-up founders exactly don't fall under 'wannapreneur' category but they lack vision, intent to innovate and differentiate.

To sum it, Wannapreneurs are a very important part of the ecosystem. While, typically they lack vision and innovation however with the help of experienced mentors, coach and support system they can be moulded into sustainable and scalable ventures.
